



FEES AND PAYMENT SCHEDULE – 2019

These fees and charges must be paid by the due date, or the payment status reconciled with the Business Manager, otherwise the Student will not be given access to her room.

(GST inclusive where applicable subject to Australian Tax Office requirements)

- \$27,120 Residency Fee for a 40 week Student Residency Agreement

- \$13,560 Residency Fee per Semester is to be paid by 15 February 2019 for Semester 1, and by 19 July 2019 for Semester 2. Note: For new Students who commence residence in Semester 1, the Residency Fee and Induction Program fees and charges are due on 8 February 2019.

- \$ 475 Share room Residency Fee per Semester of \$9,600 (for two students)

- \$ 2,020 Admission Confirmation Fee — on commencement of residency, this Fee will be applied towards the Security Deposit of \$1,200.00, a Key Deposit of \$100.00, and a once only Registration Fee of \$720.00. (Note: If the Student Residency Agreement is terminated pursuant to Clause 29, there is no entitlement to a refund of the Admission Confirmation Fee, which will be managed according to that clause.)

- \$ 720 Registration Fee is a once-only fee for new Students and includes \$200 for life membership of the Alumnae Association, a \$200 registration fee and a \$320 start up fee. The \$200 Alumnae fee is refundable if the prospective student is not offered a place to study at the University of Sydney.

- \$1,200 Security Deposit is held by the College for the purpose of reimbursing the College (on the Student's departure from College) for loss, damage or liability incurred by the College arising out of a student's breach of the Residency Agreement, the cost of repairing the Student's room and payment of unpaid fees, fines or outstanding charges.

- \$ 100 Key Deposit is held by the College for the purpose of reimbursing the College for loss or damage to the student's saflok key. During residency, if a Student's key is lost, it attracts a \$40 replacement charge or up to a \$10 lock out fee if the key is misplaced. The \$100 Key Deposit is refundable if the prospective student is not offered a place to study at the University of Sydney.

- \$ 415 Covers an Induction program of activities and presentations provided in Semester 1 for College fresher Students (called Women's Welcome Week). The Fee includes residency for up to three (3) nights, together with the cost of running a number of Induction programs and events. Students who have previously been residents of the College do not pay this Fee. Students who join the College in Semester 2 must participate in an Induction Program, which is held during the first week of Semester and therefore do not pay this Fee.

\$ 400 Student Club Membership is collected on behalf of Students twice yearly and charged at \$200 each Semester and invoiced as part of the Residency Fee statement.

Under the current Student Residency Agreement, check-out time at the end of the 2019 academic year will be 10am on Saturday 30 November 2019.

For Students departing College for overseas exchange in Semester 2, check-out time will be 10am on Saturday 13 July 2019.

International and regional Students or Students with examinations later than the relevant check-out time may arrange to remain longer at College for an additional fee provided they book that accommodation, with the Front Office Manager, by the published deadline at the time.

\$ 92 Casual Residency Fee per day is charged to resident Students who reside at the College outside the 40-week Residency Agreement and includes per night the cost of a room, food, utilities, linen and internet but excludes the provision of academic (tutorial and academic assistance) and co-curricular programs.

\$200 **A Late Check-out Fee** will be charged for Students who fail to either vacate their room and/or check-out by 10am, or at a check-out time agreed previously with the Front Office Manager. Payment of the \$200 Late Check-out Fee is required either at check-out time or will be debited against the refund of the Student's deposit monies if the Student is departing Women's College for the final time.
